

## **With reference to Section -4 (1) (b)(i) of the RTI Act,2005**

### **1.1 Organizational Set Up**

Mizoram State Commission for Protection of Child Rights was established to look after the rights of the Children in respect of the Constitution and United Nations Conventions on the Right of the Children and to assist the Government for the rights of the children. Mizoram State Commission for Protection of Child Rights was mandated by 'The Commission for Protection of Child Rights Act 2005' and is headed by the Chairperson who is assisted by Three (3) Members, Secretary, Superintendent, Legal Officer and other supporting staff.

### **2. Its functions**

- (a) analyze existing law, policy and practice to assess compliance with Convention on the Rights of the Child undertake inquiries and produce reports on any aspect of policy or practice affecting children and comment on proposed new legislation from a child rights perspective;
- (b) present to the Central Government annually and at such other intervals as the Commission may deem fit, reports upon the working of those safeguards;
- (c) undertake formal investigations where concern has been expressed either by children themselves or by concerned person on their behalf;
- (d) ensure that the work of the Commission is directly informed by the views of children in order to reflect their priorities and perspectives;
- (e) promote, respect and serious consideration of the views of children in its work and in that of all Government Departments and Organizations dealing with child;
- (f) produce and disseminate information about child rights;
- (g) compile and analyze data on children;
- (h) promote the incorporation of child rights into the school curriculum, teachers training and training of personnel dealing with children.
- (i) analyse existing laws, policy and practice to assess compliance on Convention on the Rights of the Child, undertake inquiries and produce reports on any aspect of policy or practice affecting children and comment on proposed new legislation from a child rights' perspective;
- (j) undertake formal investigations where concern has been expressed either by children themselves or by concerned persons on their behalf, or by public at large, or in the media;
- (k) ensure that the work of the commission is to be directly informed of the views of children by themselves in order to reflect their priorities and perspectives;
- (l) promote, respect and take into serious consideration the views of children in its work and, in that, of all Government Departments and Organizations dealing with children;
- (m) compile and analyse data on children; and
- (n) promote inclusion of the subject of child rights into school curriculum, teachers' training and training of personnel dealing with children.

## Duties:

In addition to the above, the following duties are assigned to the Commission as per chapter 3, Section 13 of the MSCPCR rules 2017:

- (a) examine and review the safeguards provided by or under any law for the time being in force for the protection of child rights and recommend measures for their effective implementation;
- (b) present to the Central Government, annually and at such other intervals, as the Commission may deem fit, reports upon the working of those safeguards;
- (c) inquire into violation of child rights and recommend initiation of proceedings in such cases;
- (d) examine all factors that inhibit the enjoyment of rights of children affected by terrorism, communal violence, riots, natural disaster, domestic violence, HIV/AIDS, trafficking, maltreatment, torture and exploitation, pornography and prostitution and recommend appropriate remedial measures;
- (e) look into the matters relating to children in need of special care and protection including children in distress, marginalized and disadvantaged children, children in conflict with law, juveniles, children without family and children of prisoners and recommend appropriate remedial measures;
- (f) study treaties and other international instruments and undertake periodical review of existing policies, programmes and other activities on child rights and make recommendations for their effective implementation in the best interest of children;
- (g) study treaties and other international instruments and undertake periodical review of existing policies, programmes and other activities on child rights and make recommendations for their effective implementation in the best interest of children; undertake and promote research in the field of child rights;
- (h) spread child rights literacy among various sections of the society and promote awareness of the safeguards available for protection of these rights through publications, the media, seminars and other available means;
- (i) inspect or cause to be inspected any juvenile custodial home, or any other place of residence or institution meant for children, under the control of the Central Government or any State Government or any other authority, including any institution run by a social organisation; where children are detained or lodged for the purpose of treatment, reformation or protection and take up with these authorities for remedial action, if found necessary;
- (j) inquire into complaints and take *Suo motu* notice of matters relating to,—
  - (i) deprivation and violation of child rights;
  - (ii) non-implementation of laws providing for protection and development of children;
  - (iii) non-compliance of policy decisions, guidelines or instructions aimed at mitigating hardships to and ensuring welfare of the children and to provide relief to such children, or take up the issues arising out of such matters with appropriate authorities; and
- (k) such other functions as it may consider necessary for the promotion of child rights and any other matter incidental to the above functions.

1. The Commission shall not inquire into any matter which is pending before a State Commission or any other Commission duly constituted under any law for the time being in force. No fee shall be chargeable on complaints.

2. Powers and duties of its Officers and employees.

There is no distinct power or duties invested upon the Officers and staff of the Commission apart from the Mizoram State Commission for Protection of Child Rights Rules 2017.

3. All decisions are made in the Commission Meeting and the meeting was not intervene three months between the last meeting and the next meeting. Four members including the Chairperson shall form the quorum at every meeting of the Commission.

4. All employees in the discharge of their functions adhere to all Central rules and regulations, instructions as adopted by the Government of Mizoram.
